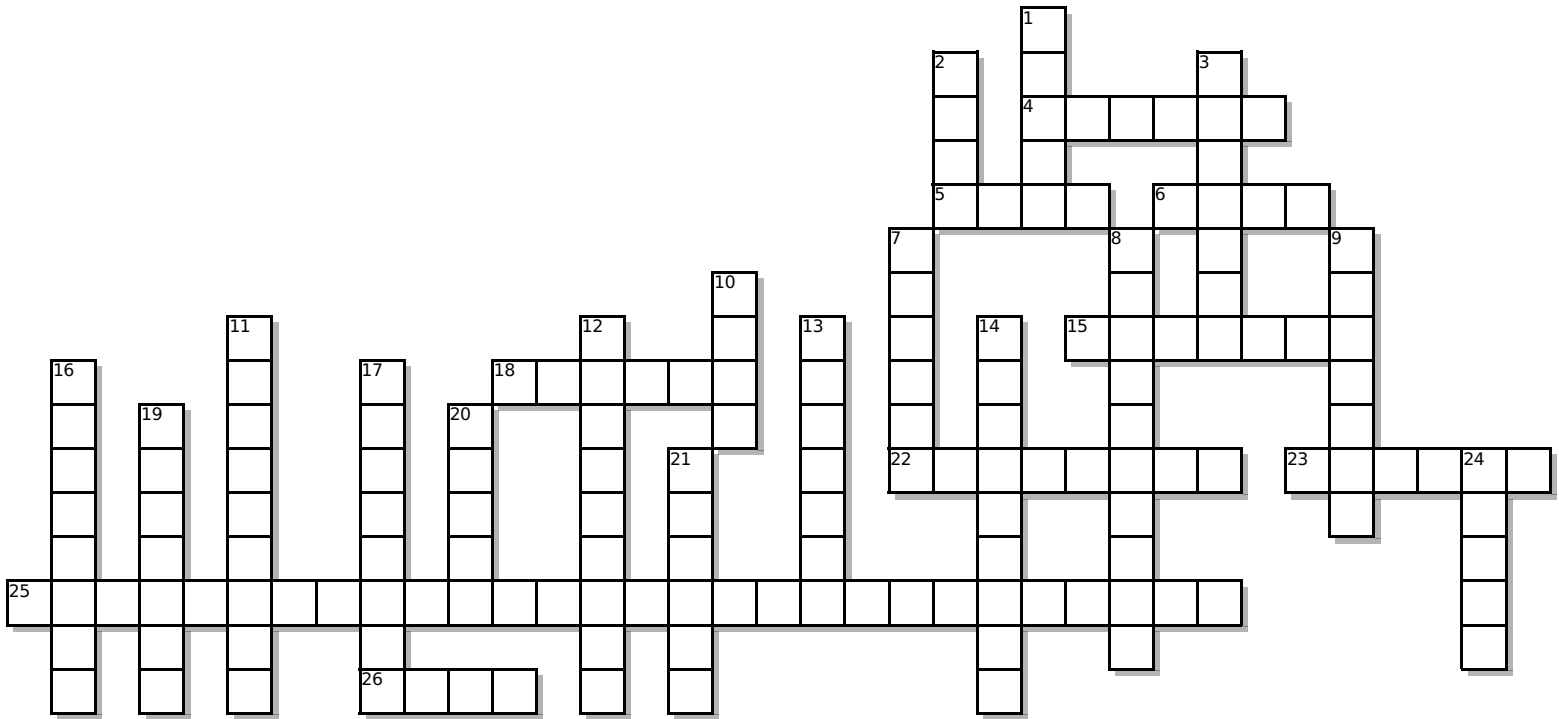


Animal Puzzle

ACROSS

- 4 any of a genus of large gregarious primates of Africa and southwestern Asia having a long square naked muzzle
- 5 a southern African antelope.
- 6 A large cat that lives in prides, found in Africa and northwestern India. Considered as the King of animals
- 15 a large fleet African ruminant mammal. A very tall animal and has a very long neck and a short coat with dark blotches separated by pale lines
- 18 any of several small African antelopes comprising two genera
- 22 any of a family of thickset usually extremely large nearly hairless herbivorous mammals that have a snout elongated into a muscular trunk and two incisors in the upper jaw developed especially in the male into large ivory tusks and that include two living forms and various extinct relatives
- 23 any of several small omnivorous canids of Africa and Asia having large ears, long legs, and bushy tails
- 25 an organization that promotes hunting among African American communities
- 26 -a large grayish brown African antelope with large annulated spirally twisted horns

DOWN

- 1 related to the horse but distinctively and conspicuously patterned in stripes of black or dark brown and white
- 2 any of numerous slender-legged ruminant mammals, found also in North America
- 3 a very large typically black-colored anthropoid ape of equatorial Africa that has a stocky body with broad shoulders and long arms and is less erect and has

- smaller ears than the chimpanzee
- 7 domesticated quadrupeds held as property or raised for use; specifically : bovine animals on a farm or ranch
- 8 an anthropoid ape of equatorial Africa that is smaller and more arboreal than the gorilla
- 9 a long-legged spotted swift-moving African and formerly Asian cat about the size of a small leopard that has blunt nonretractile claws
- 10 any of various swift long-eared mammals that are usually solitary or sometimes live in pairs and have the young open-eyed and furred at birth
- 11 an antelope of the central African swampland that is nearly related to the harnessed antelope but shows white striping only when young
- 12 either of two large African antelopes with a head like that of an ox, short mane, long tail, and horns in both sexes that curve downward and outward
- 13 a large strong cat of southern Asia and Africa that is adept at climbing and is usually tawny or buff with black spots arranged in rosettes/called also panther
- 14 a stocky antelope of sub-Saharan Africa that commonly frequent streams or wet areas
- 16 a small African striped antelope especially of sub-Saharan forests that has spirally twisted horns in the male
- 17 a southern African antelope
- 19 a swift-footed 2-toed flightless ratite bird of Africa . Can weigh up 300 pounds
- 20 a very large herbivorous 4-toed chiefly aquatic artiodactyl mammal of sub-Saharan Africa with an extremely large head and mouth, bare and very thick grayish skin, and short legs; also : a smaller closely related mammal of western Africa
- 21 an antelope that inhabits wetlands of southern Africa
- 24 a large light-colored Saharan antelope that has long spiralling horns
